1. Apologies for absence Councillors B. Cook & .C. Dow.

Mr.I.Rawson resigned as Parish Councillor on the 31st August. . East Suffolk Council have been informed and the bye election process has commenced.

2. To receive member's declarations of interest No interests were declared.

3. Minutes The minutes of a Meeting of the Council held on the 8th July, 2024 had been circulated and were therefore taken as read. It was proposed by Mrs. Bignell seconded by Mr. Harris that these minutes be signed by the Chairman as a true record. Approved: 8 members voting for the motion 1 member voted against.

The minutes of an Extraordinary Meeting of the Council held on the 29th July, 2024 had been circulated and were therefore taken as read. It was proposed by Mrs. Bignell seconded by Mrs. Willetts, to unanimous approval of those members who attended, that these minutes be signed by the Chairman as a true record.

There were no matters arising from these minutes.

4. County Councillor's Report County Councillor Elaine Bryce's full report is published on the Parish Council's Web Site Home Page - Important Documents <https://grundisburgh.suffolk.cloud/> Mrs. Bryce invited anyone who had questions concerning her report to contact her.

She thanked the volunteers who had carried out the Village Spruce Up on the 17th August and was pleased that the forecourt of the Old Forge Stores had, at last, been resurfaced. Mrs. Bryce had attended the celebrations on the Village Green welcoming the Tour of Britain Cycle Race and congratulated the organisers.

The effects of flooding caused by Storm Babet were still being felt. Applications for a £5,000 grant to make the homes of those affected more resilient to future floods are available until April 2025. Investigations as to the causes are being held. She agreed with questioners that the Environmental Agency had a big responsibility which, it was felt, they were not fulfilling..

County Councillor's Report cont...

Road works on the B1079/Lower Road entrance are on schedule. Several councillors felt that the County and East Suffolk Councils should have used their powers to stop what they considered pointless and unnecessary work.

She will chase the issuing of a Licence for verge work at Grundisburgh Corner.

5. District Councillor's Report District Councillor Colin Hedgley's full report is published on the Parish Council's Web Site Home Page - Important Documents <https://grundisburgh.suffolk.cloud/>

Mr. Hedgley congratulated the Parish Council for the celebrations it had provided for the Tourn of Britain Cycle Race visit to Grundisburgh.

He was very concerned at a planning application for a new Quarry SE of the Fynn Valley Golf Club which could produce serious traffic problems for the area.

East Suffolk Council planning decisions are being delayed because of changes in the department's staff.

Changes to recycling management will result in householders being issued with an additional bin, for paper and cardboard.

6. Community Infrastructure (CIL) Report

An application has been received from Grundisburgh Tennis Club, which had been circulated to councillors prior to the meeting, for a grant of £55,000 towards the cost of floodlighting the playing field tennis courts.

After discussion it was unanimously agreed that a decision should be deferred until the proposal had been presented to the Grundisburgh Playing Field Management Committee and Planning Permission granted by East Suffolk Council.

Mr John Dunnett, at the Extraordinary Council Meeting held on the 29th July, requested that the purchase of a Beacon and Street Signs for Wood Farm Road, Elm Tree Farm Lane and Gull Lane should be considered.

Mr. Dunnett felt that the provision of a Beacon did not have the support of the Council. The Clerk had carried out research, which he had passed on to Mr. Dunnett, which included Fire Regulations which stated that Beacons should be located at least 60m away from buildings, roads, railways and public rights of way which would prohibit installing a Beacon on the Village Green or Playing Field. The Scouts are considering installing a Beacon at their new HQ.

7. Public Open Forum It was proposed by Mrs. Willetts seconded by Mr. Harris to unanimous approval, that the formal meeting be suspended, and members of the public invited to address the meeting. The following issues were raised.

Tennis Courts Floodlighting

- Light pollution should be a consideration.
- CIL money would be better spent on upgrading the Playing Field Pavilion.
- A Public Meeting should be held. It was pointed out that the public are welcomed at Grundisburgh Playing Field Management Committee meetings.
- In answering criticism a representative of the Tennis Club said the club is not privileged or exclusive, it is the cheapest club in the district offering family membership for £2.00 per week. It published membership information, fees and news on its Web Site, Grundisburgh & District News, News Group and Social Media. It is working with the Playing Field Management Committee and neighbours concerning its plans for floodlighting the tennis courts.

East Suffolk Planning Alliance (ESPA)

- ESPA and East Suffolk Council will be holding the first agreed Community Engagement Group meeting at East Suffolk House in Melton on the 3rd October. ESPA will be attending this meeting on behalf of our 55 affiliated Town/Parish Councils/Resident Groups who have experienced similar difficulties during negotiations with ESC planners. ESPA has no funds.

Scouts

- The Scouts received £110 in donations at the Tour of Britain Cycle Race celebrations on the Village Green. The provision of a Beacon on the new HQ site is being considered.

8. Chapel Field development/Footpath 20

Mrs. Willetts reported that the Oak Tree in the garden of 7 Post Mill Close which overhangs Footpath 20 and the tennis courts had been assessed by two tree surgeons who gave differing opinions on how the tree should be managed. A site meeting is being arranged to resolve the matter.

A site meeting with Hopkins Homes, Suffolk County Council Rights of Way (PROW) and the Playingfield Management Committee to resolve the issues concerning the section of Footpath 20 on the Playing Field is yet to be arranged, due to holiday arrangements at the PROW department.

9 Flooding Mr. Caryer reported.

The Parish Council has received from East Suffolk District Council a number of "Emergency Preparedness Guides", initially aimed at properties in danger of flooding, but of wider relevance. It was agreed to publicise via Grundisburgh News and make available via a suitable location (e.g. Williams Stores).

10.1 Applications approved by East Suffolk Council since last Parish Council meeting.

DC/24/1579/VOC Variation of Condition 2 of DC/22/1146/FUL Construction of detached bungalow - To substitute new attached drawing to those approved. Land Adjacent To 3 Pine Grove Grundisburgh IP13 6UL This is the site with permission to build a 2 bed bungalow. The Parish Council objected in the strongest possible terms to this applications The footprint of the proposed 3 bedroomed 2 bath room bungalow with double garage is far larger than the existing permission. The Parish Council objections were ignored. Highways considered that there was no problem with access in Lower Road.

DC/24/1943/TCA Green Bank South The Street Grundisburgh. Silver Birch (T1 on plan) - Reduce height by 3 metres and prune side by 2.5 metres

DC/24/2070/FUL Meadowcroft Meeting Lane Grundisburgh
Dormer Extension at First Floor Level

DC/24/1659/FUL Mistyleigh Boundary Farm Clopton Road Grundisburgh
Installation of 20 ground mounted Solar PV panels, connected to the property by underground cable - including the provision of battery storage.

DC/24/1069/FUL. Retrospective application Basketmakers Cottage Woodbridge Road Grundisburgh.

To remove and replace along the front boundary of the property:

- i) all of the old wooden panel fencing wooden posts;
- ii) the old wooden driveway field gate its wooden posts;
- iii) the old wooden picket fencing and wooden picket fencing gate and its wooden posts

DC/24/2432/P3R Prior Notification. Stanaway Farm, Charity Lane, Otley. Change of use of existing farm building to commercial use (B8 Storage and Distribution)

Objections sent Grundisburgh & Culpho Parish Council object in the strongest possible terms to the above proposal. B8 Storage and Distribution use for this redundant farm building is a major change of use in this area. Charity Lane is a narrow single-track road with no purpose-built passing places. The bland term used by Hollins Architects Surveyors & Planning Consultants in their planning statement *The site has an existing access, and the change of use is likely to have a neutral effect on vehicle movements; Therefore, the local highway network will not be negatively impacted.* shows just how little local knowledge has been gained during their consultation. The local authority would have no control over the size of vehicle accessing the site. When combined with the existing commercial use at the site, the cumulative impact would result in a high level of activity at this rural site.

The statutory consultees do not mention the narrowness of Charity Lane or the group of residential properties at Grundisburgh Corner. Their lived experience on the lane is no longer one of countryside tranquillity but the creeping daily increase in traffic. No longer seasonal agricultural vehicles but HGV's using Charity Lane increasingly as a rat run to avoid the ever-increasing difficulties on the B1078 and B1079.

The College and the Farm traffic are both seasonal – this application would see a steep increase in regular traffic accessing the storage and distribution site. The safety of those living and working on Charity Lane will be impacted 24/7 by this escalating change of use. The lane is signed officially as unsuitable for HGV's. Grundisburgh & Culpho Parish Council would urge East Suffolk Council to refuse this proposal at this stage.

Planning -Applications approved Stanaway Farm cont...

Otley Parish Clerk, sent following comment Otley Parish Council has read and reviewed the documentation for this Planning Application and while on balance they have No Objection they would like to highlight that the change of use will lead to an increase in traffic on what is a small country lane. It should also be noted that the lane is not suitable for HGVs vehicles.

13 Roads and Transport Mr. G. Caryer reported.

A Culpho resident has suggested that a traffic survey be carried out, to get a better understanding of the volumes and speed of traffic. They asked for guidance on the cost of a survey from Suffolk Highways (the tube strip attached to a recording box).

Response from County Council Highways:

A survey is possible here, but I'm not sure what it would tell us, as we may not have any data to compare it to. I would expect that traffic volumes have increased, as they have on many of our roads, and with new developments in the area, this will no doubt be the case. In terms of speed, as it's NSL (a 60), I would anticipate the average speeds are around the 40mph mark. If the end goal is to just determine speeds for reference, then by all means we can undertake a survey. If the resident would like to consider a reduction in speed limit, I would advise they have a little look at our speed limit policy to gauge whether they feel it's suitable.

There are two types of survey, tubes (£435) and radar (£390) plus VAT for both. We could also possibly use our SID with the display turned off.

14 Footpaths & Conservation

Proposal to begin negotiations to lease land adjoining the allotments through to Meeting Lane as a Conservation Area.

This piece of land, with the area now used as allotments, was originally part of the curtilage of Thistleton, The Street, Grundisburgh and is owned by R.J. Isbell & Son (East Anglia) Ltd. The Parish Council manages the allotments under an agreement with the owners dated 9th February 1999.

This land has for many years been hired by a resident who for health reasons is having to give up this arrangement.

The proposal is that the Parish Council should take over the management of the area under a management agreement with the owner.

There are various ways in which the area could be conserved e.g. rewilding, wild flower meadow. Greenways Countryside Project could be consulted. It could be used as a Nature Study area by Grundisburgh Primary School who shares a boundary with the site.

It was agreed that the Clerk should write to the site's owner expressing the Parish council's interest in managing the site and asking the form and length of the agreement he would require.

The length of the lease would be critical in devising a management plan for the area.

15 Village Maintenance Mr. A. Dunnett reported.

The Village Spruce Up on the 17th August was carried out on the Village Green area by 20 volunteers and was very well received by the community with more than 140 'likes' via the village Facebook Page.

The three benches were stained, white posts and rails painted, directional sign post painted - the roundel is undergoing an extensive refurbishment by Mr. Bagley. .

A further session is planned for Saturday 21st September focusing on the Village Green Bus Shelter, Lamp Post and the Village Sign.

A survey was conducted to assess what road signs need to be replaced. Some are OK, others illegible and broken, many signs should be replaced. It is recommendation at this moment is that the Parish Council purchase the following replacements:

- 10 No. 300mmm 30mph Signs
- A 'Triangular Try Your Brakes' and 'Ford' signs

Chris Dow and Allen Dunnett carried out sign improvements along the B1079 between its junction with Ipswich Road and Lower Road. They cut back obstructing foliage and hedges and cleaned the signs. A sign was salvaged from the post broken by a hedge trimmer and added this to SID's post. The tatty Grundisburgh sign was removed so that the lettering can be replaced.

The Finance Sub Committee will hold a meeting during w/c 18th November to conduct a general review of the Council's financial position and a meeting during w/c 9th December to primarily to agree a recommended budget and precept for 2025/2026 to submit to the full council at its 13th January 2025 meeting.

18. Public Open Forum It was proposed by Mrs. Willetts seconded by Mr. Caryer,. to unanimous approval, that the formal meeting be suspended, and members of the public invited to address the meeting. The following issues were raised.

- Land in Meeting Lane (Item 14) This site could be used as a Nature Study Area. Some work on the overgrown bordering trees had been carried out by neighbours but more work needed to be done. They had been offered a lease on the land by the owner but had declined.
- Burglaries Two incidents had occurred in Grundisburgh since the previous meeting. Both had been reported to the police.
- Lower Road Gulleys are regularly blocked by silt flowing from the Chapel Field development. The Highways Authority need evidence of flooding before they will take any action.
- Half Moon Lane Steps leading to the Public Footpath are broken and need repair. Mr. Caryer will inform East Suffolk Council again.

19. Items for next meeting Mr. J. Dunnett requested that the striking of the hours on St. Mary's Church Clock be restored.

20.1 Orchard End/Gurdon Road footpath Hedges bordering the footpath are overgrown and need cutting back.

20.2 B1079 Hedges from Half Moon House to bungalows This would be an ideal time to cut the hedges whilst the road is closed for road works at the Lower Road junction.
